I don't think so. There should be a light "test" position or button.
Also you should definitely be seeing an "alternator fail" light as the alternator is not charging while engine stopped. Brain escapes what high temp light should be doing.
You should also be hearing an audible alarm. This not happening is often related to the peizioelectric(sp?) horn failing - the round bigger "grill" next to the tach. It is fussy but you can replace this.
I have removed the panel on my Volvo and carefully removed all the connections and cleaned them. My lights all work now but the horn is still doa
It's bizarre how much "electronics" is packed in that control panel. Who figured

The warning horn is for low oil pressure. Until the engine starts or turns over enough to generate oil pressure, the alarm sounds. I don't know what happens with an overheat. The PO disconnected the temperature warning and added a gauge with it's own transducer. Unfortunately, the horn didn't sound and the gauge failed when critters blocked the water inlet. Had a mechanic change the transducer back to the stock warning light. Assume it will sound the horn if the engine ever overheats. Haven't seen any light for the temperature because the engine hasn't overheated, that I'm aware of, since switching back to the stock system. Engine made me very aware it was overheating when the inlet was blocked filling the cabine with steam.

Re: Yanmar 3GM30F warning lights at startup?
The schematic shows the buzzer is connected to the high water temp, low oil pressure, (and rubber seal on the sail drive if you have one).
There is a toggle switch that in one position lights up the tach, in the other position tests the high water temp light. (This position is momentary if I recall.)
Oil and charge lights should be on with key on and engine stopped.
Don't remember if this alternator is self exciting or not. If it is excited by the battery, it gets that current through the warning light. If the warning light is burned out I assume the alternator won't excite and won't produce current.
